Sunbeams the latest to benefit from safety Target Zero Scheme

Whitehaven based Sunbeams Carer and Toddler Group recently received a donation of £750 from the Sellafield Product Residues Store project team. The donation was part of the project's 'Target Zero' Scheme which has been operated since September 2005.

The scheme involves all of the project's contracting companies and Sellafield Limited contributing £250 to a fund in recognition of safe working. Since the Target Zero was launched it has made 39 awards, resulting in a grand total of £59,250 being donated to local good causes.

The Sunbeams Carer and Toddler Group meet every Tuesday morning in the United Reformed Church in Whitehaven marketplace and offer the opportunity for children to play, carry out educational activities and mix with others of their age.

As well as the children benefiting from the group the opportunity to meet with other parents and centre staff is also seen as a valuable tool in offering advice and practical support.

Roger Shail who works for Sellafield Ltd, attends the group with his son Lincoln. He said: "I am very happy to have had the opportunity to nominate Sunbeams for this award.

"The money will be used to keep the class running to the high standard they have already achieved, by purchasing replacement toys, craft and art materials, as well as the occasional outing and replacement furniture.

"Newcomers are always welcome and are only asked to contribute £1 per week to fund the food and drinks that are provided for the children."
