Sellafield News goes digital!

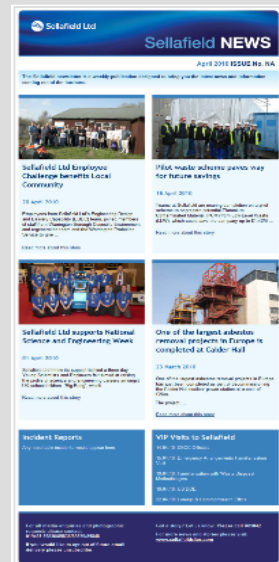
As of next week, the Sellafield News as it currently exists will be replaced with a new online version.

Marian shares a 'finn' life

A Sellafield Ltd employee has published a book on the life of her father almost 40 years after he wrote it.

Marian Finn who works for Demand and Inventory, Thorp Engineering has worked at Sellafield since early 1992. She is the youngest of five daughters and the sixth of 10 children with most her family living away from West Cumbria.

Last year while at home nursing a broken ankle, Marian decided to type up all her father's old stories; it was doing this that led her to go that bit further. She looked into publishing some of her father's work and decided to go down the self publishing route herself.

Marian said: "My father had been a keen amateur artist but lost his eyesight to glaucoma in his 60s. As he couldn't see well enough to paint he decided to concentrate on writing short stories.

"At this time I worked in HQ RAF Germany in Rheindahlen. While stationed there he used to send the stories to me for typing up. Some I thought were really good so I suggested he write his own life story - which he later did in the 1970s."

"The book covers my father's life from 1925 to 1956. It provides a fascinating insight into what life was like for a young man in Scotland and the North of England during the depression of the 1930s, constantly being laid off and seeking work. It highlights the respect he held for his parents and family and provides a glimpse of a bygone age when a wonderful party was based on a glass of lemonade and a dance round the church hall."

The book 'A Finn Life by No Means' is on sale through Author House and Amazon published under her first name "Rose Finn."
